DESCRIPTION

North Bank Park is one of downtown Columbus' riverfront park destinations. As the first park to be redeveloped under the Columbus Riverfront Vision Plan, it set the standard for the entire urban riverfront. The park replaces an earthen berm and retaining wall that had disconnected the river from this part of downtown. Located on the pavilion plaza is a children's fountain that is ideal for summer time play, plenty of shaded seating, and a dining terrace.

OUR ROLE

MKSK led the master planning and design of all park elements and trail design as the prime consultant, leading a multidiscipline team of geotechnical, structural, civil, transportation and environmental engineers, architects, and graphic designers.
